Astonished – that was how I felt as Pastor Margarita picked up the machete and started swinging. Chop, chop, chop as she split wood for the fire. There she was right beside the women at Spirit of Peace in Tepeagua, El Salvador, pitching in to make the bread for the day.

Tepeagua is a small rural community near the coast in El Salvador. Before the civil war, the land was owned and farmed by a cooperative group of campesinos or farmers. They worked together raising crops and animals, sharing the land and the harvest. After the war, this small community was created – simple homes on small lots, but still with a connection to the surrounding land.

Tepeagua is a community made up of mostly single mothers and children. Pastor Margarita encouraged and empowered the women to start a community bakery which now operates two days a week. The pastor also recently helped the women to start a second business producing soy milk.
